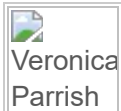

him flown back out to North Carolina to see him, and again when his dad was in North Carolina. But now he is gone forever, and I don't think I will ever be able to accept that. Things like this shouldn't happen to someone with so much love and joy. He was NEVER upset or mad, ever. I can literally never remember a time when he was upset. He was the happiest kid on earth and made me happy whenever I was with him.

Trey was the best person a person could be. The BEST. His personality, morals, what he stood for, the happiness he had 24/7, made him truly amazing. He was my best friend. I plan on getting married eventually, and my whole life I had planned on asking him to be my BEST man. Because that's really what he was, and no one was better at being a human being that he was.

Me and Trey shared a lifetime of joy, happiness and memories together in his short, well-lived life, and I can't wait to see him again.

Have fun playing Burning Crusade again in heaven buddy. We always talked about heaven being just that. I will join you one day.

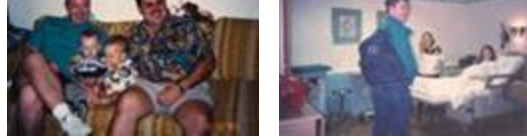

One of the 600 pound calves got a little frisky as we put the feed in the trough and jumped across the trough. It barely missed Trey. He stood his ground and loved every minute. We went fishing and to see the 4th of July parade. He loved the "funny cars" with the souped up detailing. Later as a 13 year old teenager, he returned and told me he came for entertainment and not to work, so I sent him home, as work was the precursor to reward. In the last few years, as a young man, he realized his status as a helper for an elderly person and was more manly, and freely offered to help when he came to visit. Four days before he died he helped his father unload hay, and put it out for the cattle.
